PROGRAM GENERAL OBJECTIVES

Promote collaborative innovation processes to solve public problems

Encourage public and private participation, alliances and collaborative networks, as well as the incubation of innovative projects to address local challenges with sustainable solutions, supported by the collective knowledge of the communities.

Empowerment for access to better goods and services

Enhance the use of data to improve public services and generate economic opportunities, provide empowerment tools to strengthen transparency and social control mechanisms, bring citizens closer to decision-making processes, and generate capacities in youth and various sectors of society.

Access to technology and resources for social entrepreneurship

Facilitate the creation of innovation spaces with access to technology and specialized curricula to nurture entrepreneurship and new opportunities within the job market, boost digital transformation processes, and encourage the development of prototypes through access to seed funds.

DIA INNOVATION LABS

DIA Labs constitute a unique ecosystem for innovation and entrepreneurship, through access to technology, training, mentoring, competitions, and seed funds, which allow youth to develop disruptive and innovative ideas that tackle local problems and challenges. The DIA methodology helps the creation of low-cost solutions to increase livelihood opportunities in vulnerable communities.

PUBLIC INNOVATION

Public innovation projects seek to work with representatives from local and national governments, civil society organizations, media, and the private sector to strengthen democratic processes within the region. Through training, collaborative sessions, and innovation processes, the DIA initiative promotes solutions to governmental issues related to the use of Open Data, Open Government, and GovTech.

IMPACT

Since 2016, DIA has impacted over 6,484 young people and representatives from diverse sectors of society. Over 1,126 participants have developed innovation projects, of which 142 have received seed funding.

The work has enabled multisector empowerment and has developed innovation projects that not only help build economic opportunities, but also improve the quality of life of communities and modernize democratic processes in the region.
